The needs of children are great and many face significant threats to their well being. According to the National Center for Child Poverty, about 15 million children in the United States – 21% of all children – live in families with incomes below the federal poverty threshold. Poverty can create circumstances that impede children's ability to learn and can contribute to social, emotional, behavioral problems and overall poor health. **Christ Child Society members focus on improving the lives of the most vulnerable in their communities.** 



Since 1887, our volunteers have been driven by faith, love and a desire to make a difference. Guided by National's Challenging Poverty Initiative, we create localized programs, often partnering with other organizations serving those who lack resources.Today, over 5,500 members from 45 chapters across 22 states volunteer nearly 400,000 hours and serve more than 75,000 children and their families annually. We are moved to action by the mission of our founder, Mary Virginia Merrick, who said: **"Nothing is ever too much to do for a child."** We are privileged to provide accompaniment in the midst of isolation and hope in the midst of uncertainty. As volunteers, we are humbled by the children we serve who teach us important life lessons.

# WHAT WE DO

Every member of a Christ Child Chapter is also a member of the National Christ Child Society. Chapters receive support from a professional National staff and

vibrant volunteer board leadership, drawn from chapters across the country. The National organization extends the Society's message and mission and helps chapters build their leadership and expand their local impact.

The service programs of each chapter are tailored to the needs of their community. The local organizations lead the way, and their members define the manner in which the following goals are accomplished:

### **Providing Basic Resources**

Each chapter participates in our layette program, the unifying signature program in honor of our founder, which provides a bundle of essentials for newborns. Christ Child Chapters donate approximately 25,000 layettes nationwide per year. Many chapters provide other resources such as coats, warm clothing, shoes and school uniforms to children in their communities. Chapters provide backpacks filled with school supplies, weekend meals or personal supplies for children suddenly living in foster care or a shelter.

### **Enriching Education**

Many of our chapters partner with teachers in local schools, pre-schools and childcare centers to provide the special ongoing personal attention needed by children to engender self esteem and a love of learning. We provide tutoring, books and volunteer support to our partners. We provide special opportunities for field trips, art and music enrichment. Chapters distribute an estimated 47,000 books each year. Many chapters provide financial opportunities for students to further their education.

### **Empowering Children and Families**

We help children and families to overcome adversity, increase resilience and become self sufficient. Our programs help to decrease isolation, build a sense of community and provide opportunities to learn about child care, decision making and ways to decrease violence in families.

The diversity of our chapter programs offers a wide range of volunteer opportunities.
